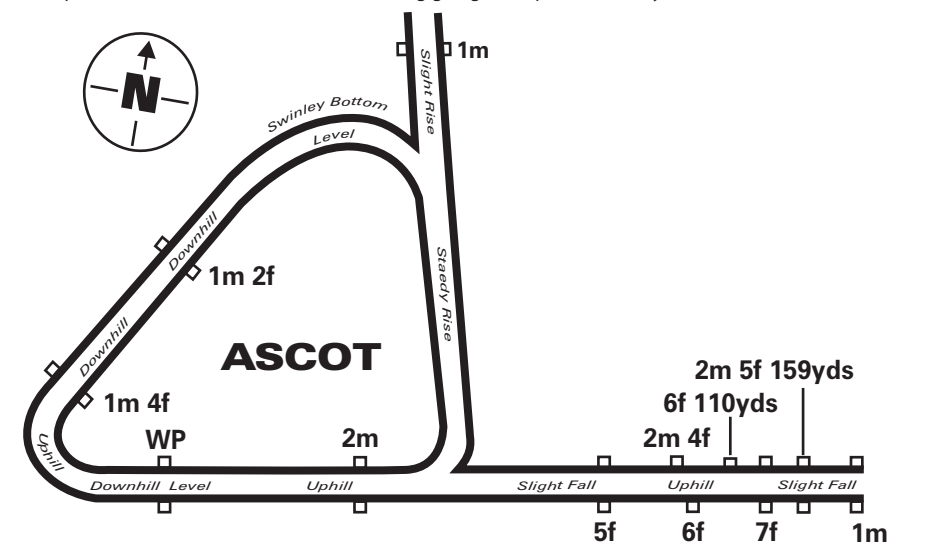


DECLARED RUNNERS

ROYAL ASCOT

Friday 17th June

The Ascot round course is a right-handed, triangular circuit of fourteen furlongs, with a run-in of 2½ furlongs. There is a straight mile course, over which the Royal Hunt Cup is run, and the Old mile course which joins the round course in Swinley Bottom. Fundamentally, the characteristics of Ascot remain unchanged by the redevelopment undertaken in 2005, though the straight mile course was moved back forty-two metres, slightly altering the position of the winning post. In addition, the racing surface on both the straight and round course was relaid, and the road crossings were removed. All races shorter than a mile are normally decided on the straight course. From the mile-and-half starting gate the round course runs downhill to the bend in Swinley Bottom, where it is level, then rises steadily to the turn into the straight, from where it is uphill until less than a furlong from the winning post, the last hundred yards being more or less level. The straight mile is slightly downhill from the start and then rises to the five-furlong gate, after which there is a slight fall before the junction with the round course. Despite the downhill run into Swinley Bottom and relatively short run-in from the final turn, the Ascot course is galloping in character. Since the redevelopment, the turn into the straight has become more sweeping and those ridden prominently can be difficult to peg back. Nowadays, the ground in the straight drains quicker than the rest of the course, meaning going descriptions can vary.



DRAW: Starting with the 2011 turf season, there has been a change to how stall numbers are classified for right-handed courses, meaning now that stall one will be placed closest to the inside rail. There has been no significant draw bias, taken overall, since the track reopened in 2006, though in any given instance pace and tactics can make it seem otherwise. A high draw has not been difficult to overcome in races starting on the round course, even in large fields.

Ratings Summary

THE ESSENTIALS

TIMEFORM RATINGS indicate the chances of the runners based on Timeform's interpretation of their form. The ratings on their own should never be taken to indicate a selection. No horse can be confidently expected to run to its best form under unsuitable conditions. Similarly a relatively low rating does not necessarily suggest that the horse has little chance, rather it is an indication of the amount of improvement the horse will probably have to show.

The **COMMENTARIES** contain a wealth of valuable detail about each horse's record, what sort of form it is in, ground and distance requirements, temperamental characteristics, favoured tactics, and so on. Taken as a whole, the commentary should suggest how likely the horse is to reproduce, or improve upon, the level of form indicated by the rating.

TIMEFORM HORSES IN FOCUS are selected by Timeform's racereaders and handicappers as being of particular interest, following their most recent performance. The most relevant in today's races are identified at the end of their commentary.

TIMEFORM COMPUTER TIMEFIGURES measure performances in terms of race times, rather than form against other horses. Generally speaking, the more recent a good timefigure the greater its significance. The three best timefigures from the horse's last ten outings are shown.

RATINGS SYMBOLS AND SUMMARY

The following symbols sometimes appear alongside (or instead of) a rating:-

- p the horse is likely to improve
- P the horse is capable of much better
- ? the rating is suspect or (used alone) the horse can't be assessed with confidence
- + the horse may be better than rated
- \$ the horse is unreliable (for temperamental or other reasons)
- \$\$ the horse is so unsatisfactory as to be not worth a rating

A **RATINGS SUMMARY** appears below each rating. It shows how each runner has performed in up to its last six races (most recent first).

GUIDE TO ABBREVIATIONS

PEDIGREE colour/sex

Colours: b-bay; bl-black; br-brown; ch-chestnut; gr-grey; ro-roan.

Sex: c-colt; f-filly; g-gelding; h-horse; m-mare; r-rig.

This information is followed by the horse's sire, its dam and the dam's sire, each shown with its highest annual Timeform rating.

PAST PERFORMANCES surface/distance/going/finishing position

Surface: if there is no prefix the race was on turf. All-Weather surfaces are indicated by f-fibresand; p-polytrack; a-other artificial surface.

Distance: shown in furlongs to the nearest tenth of a furlong.

Going: f-firm (or fast); m-good to firm; g-good (or standard); d-good to soft or dead; s-soft (slow, sloppy or muddy); v-heavy. Timeform uses its own assessment of the going, which may not coincide with the one given by the racecourse.

Finishing position: shown if the horse finished in the first six. * denotes the horse won.

Also shown is the date of the most recent outing. If the horse has run over the jumps since its latest start on the Flat this performance is also included (marked JJ). NR indicates no races.

RATINGS SUMMARY

The first column indicates distance (rounded to the nearest furlong) and going.

The second column shows the Timeform rating achieved, adjusted today's weights.

The third column shows the BHA or Irish Turf Club mark if the race was a handicap. For other types of races the abbreviations are G1-Group/Grade 1; G2-Group/Grade 2; G3-Group/Grade 3; L-Listed; W-weight-for-age/minor events/classified stakes; M-maiden; N-nursery; S-seller; C-claiming event; A-amateur, apprentice, ladies event, etc.

TIMEFIGURES timefigure/course/distance/going

A tick after a timefigure shows it was recorded last season. Timefigures recorded on an all-weather surface (which are shown in *italics*) do not appear for races on turf.

The first two letters of a course's name are used except Bv-Beverley; Cp-Chepstow; Ct-Catterick; Hm-Hamilton; Nb-Newbury; Nc-Newcastle; Nm-Newmarket; Sb-Salisbury.

OTHER INFORMATION

The **TRW** figures (which appear for non-handicap races) are the weight-adjusted Timeform Ratings which the winners have achieved in the same race in the five previous years. A horse with a rating or timefigure better than the TRW figures should be considered seriously.

Overweight carried by **JOCKEYS** should be deducted from the race rating. (Please note that all Timeform advertising statements are based upon the actual ratings given on the card.)

The **DRAW** sometimes has considerable importance, and, if so, advice to that effect appears in the notes below the racecourse diagram.

COURSE TO COURSE RATINGS are usually included for other Flat meetings taking place at the same time.

MAIL ORDER TIMEFORM RACE CARDS

Timeform Race Cards for Flat meetings are usually printed and posted following the 48-hour declaration stage and incorporate full jockeys' colours.

Because of postal schedules, meetings from Sunday to Tuesday have to be covered by Race Cards prepared at the five-day entry stage. Please note that five-day cards are printed in black and white only.
